There is only one month left for the Spotlight Exhibit on two Cold War stories. A new exhibit will be installed in the first week of April.

Presently, you can learn about an airman who guarded intercontinental ballistic missiles in the 1960s on the cold high plains of eastern Montana. The other story involves an infantryman who stood sentinel on the border between East and West Germany for nine years in the 1970s, waiting for the Communist forces to surge into Western Europe.

We also invite you to view our newest exhibit, *Honoring a Generation's Sacrifice: Personal Stories of Vietnam Veterans and their Service to Our Nation*, now on display through Spring 2012. The opening reception in March 30. We invite you and your students to attend.
