The Tate Geological Museum staff members have been busy over the past four years digging up “Dee,” the Columbian Mammoth. Now Dee’s skeleton is mounted and on display at the Tate, and it’s the largest mounted Columbian Mammoth skeleton in the WORLD!

Bring your students to the Tate to learn all about the life of Dee, from the Tundra to the Tate.

- What was it like in this area when he was alive?
- What other animals hung out with Dee?
- What did he eat?
- Who ate him?
- How old was he when he died?
- How did he die?
- How do we know?

Your students will be “wowed” by Dee’s size (you have to see it to believe it) and fascinated with his story. This is truly a treasure for teachers all over the state to experience and use as part of your lesson plan.
